

# Why Conduct MS4 Audits



- EPA provides grants to help fund ADEQ
- The grant is renewed each year
- Specifies ADEQ conduct 8, Small MS4 audits per fiscal year
- EPA conducts 2, Large/Medium MS4 audits per year
- Arizona's Memorandum of Agreement for NPDES/AZPDES program authority requires ADEQ to "...comprehensively evaluate and assess compliance with schedules, effluent limitations, and other conditions in these permits..." and "Maintain a vigorous program of taking timely and appropriate enforcement actions...."

# Going to the Gemba




<u>Gemba</u> – Japanese term that refers to the place where the value is created or where the work is done.

 Annual reports provide a summary of the MS4's program, but does not reveal the work that goes into it.

The audit process provides an opportunity for ADEQ

to experience the MS4's work in action.




# Purpose of Audit



When evaluating a program, ADEQ is assessing compliance with permit conditions and the MS4s Stormwater Management Program

(SWMP) Plan.



#### **Audit Benefits**



- Determination of compliance and assistance with execution of appropriate enforcement actions
- Stronger coordination and working relationship between the permitting authority and the permittee
- Better understanding by the permittee of the expectations and permit requirements of the permitting authority
- An opportunity to clarify any misunderstandings in the MS4 permit requirements or SWMP Plan
- Improved permitting authority knowledge of the permittee's operations, priorities, constraints and challenges faced when implementing a municipal stormwater program
- A more effective SWMP resulting in better water quality

# **ADEQ Audit Process**



- Each year, ADEQ selects 8, Small MS4s to be included in the annual audit process.
- They are generally randomly selected, but may include such considerations of potential environmental concern (impaired water, OAW, etc.), contents of annual report...or no annual report
- ADEQ continues to work through the list of existing MS4s to audit.
- Future goal is audit each MS4 at least once within 5year permit term

# **Program Evaluation Resource**



- ADEQ's audit process generally follows U.S. EPA's MS4 Program Evaluation Guidance document (EPA-833-R-07-003)
- ADEQ recommends MS4s obtain a copy of the EPA document to:
  - use for self audit
  - prepare for ADEQ audit

## **Audit Process**



- Provide roughly 2weeks notice of audit to MS4
- All 8 are not notified at the same time
- This is to make the process equitable for all (not provide 2 weeks notice for City A and 6 weeks for City B)
- Set up conference call upon notification to set schedule, help prepare the MS4
- Records request –provide information to
   ADEQ/contractor



### **Audit Process**



- ADEQ will select all or some of the 6 minimum control measures to be evaluated
- Typically, it will be 3 of the 6, so not a complete assessment of the entire stormwater program
- The "on-site" portion of the audit will last 1.5 to 2 days
- Includes record reviews and site visits (construction sites [public and private], municipal facilities, etc.)

## **Audit Process**



## Other things that ADEQ will look at:

- Mapping (status, features, tools, capabilities, etc.)
- System outfalls
- Legal authority (municipal code/ordinance, etc.)
- Staffing / personnel roles




# How to Prepare



- The MS4 should identify appropriate personnel and make them available for all or some of the on-site process
- The document review will include examples of inspection records, SOPs, reports, etc.

"If it isn't documented, it didn't happen"



#### Closeout



 At the end of the on-site portion of the audit, ADEQ will meet with MS4 personnel to go over preliminary

findings

 ADEQ will provide the MS4 a copy of the preliminary findings report



# Final Report



 ADEQ will prepare a final report of the audit findings and will include a discussion of program deficiencies and potential violations, as appropriate.

The MS4 will be given an opportunity to formally

respond to the findings.
